What does this mean for your student?

In a Learner Centered Environment you will see:

- Flexible arrangement of classroom furniture to allow students to work alone, in pairs or groups, or with the teacher, depending on the activity.
- Student centered classroom, not teacher centered
- A "virtual" environment (Google Classroom/Blackboard) that students access regularly as an extension of their physical classroom
- Scaffolded learning experiences that provide multiple ways for students to access content

- Authentic projects that are intentionally cross-curricular.
- Digital Citizenship skills embedded into units of study
- Opportunities to collaborate with a variety of groups
- Learning activities that encourage higher order thinking
- Assessments that are authentic, relevant, and intended for a specific purpose
- The leveraging of technology to repurpose the teacher's time to allow them to meet with individual students or small groups.
